Description (Olivia Munoz):

The oblique wear observed on the right 1st molar and canine, associated with extreme wear of premolars, suggests a use of right teeth for extra-alimentary tasks, perhaps related to leather processing. Stature between 1.57 and 1.65 m

The cranium presents a circumferential deformation which has been identified as an intentional shaping of the head and it is now on display, with the lower jaw, in the National Museum of Iran. Several wormian bones (sutural ossicles) are observed at the junction of the frontal, parietals, and occipital bones, probably developed as a response to the stressful conditions of artificial cranial deformation.
